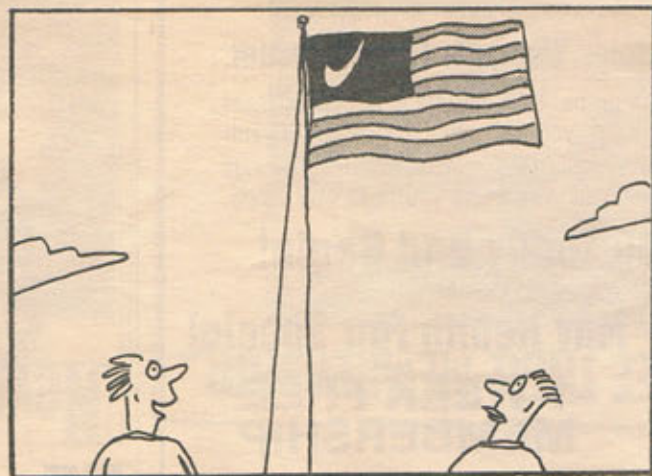

has undertaken 85 years later: "The as-
pirations of the NAM were so vast and
far-reaching as to excite at once admira-
tion and fear—admiration for the genius
that conceived them, and fear for the ef-

ance speech at Harvard University, *CBS
Evening News* anchor **DAN RATHER**
confessed: "Most of us [in television],
despite our best intentions, are practicing
bad journalism." . . . Farewell to news
conscience Fred Friendly, who quit CBS
in 1966 after it refused to preempt an *I
Love Lucy* rerun for a live Senate hearing
on the Vietnam War—and who died last
month at 82. ■
